Anka Kočevar SLEEPY ÁNZILI

folk tale, sleep, humour, excuses, laziness, sleepiness, idleness, motivation

For everyone who likes to sleep

Clear and colourful images invite the youngest readers to a fairy-tale world, in which the main character is Ánzili, a true sleeper who prefers to snooze, sleep and snore, which is why it is practically impossible to get him out of bed. Whenever the children come to wake him up, he finds an excuse to get some more sleep. He can never get enough sleep. Well, almost never – at the end of this cute comic, it turns out that sleep isn't the only thing he's interested in after all. But what is it that enticed him to finally get out of his warm bed?


Anka Kočevar transforms a folk tale about a sleepy and lazy boy into a humorous and warm story, with which everyone who finds it difficult to get out of a warm bed in the morning can identify. Due to the very vividly drawn images and great transparency, as well as the small amount of text, this fairy tale in comics is especially suitable for those children who are just starting to learn to read independently.

Anka Kočevar (1982) is an academic painter who works in the fields of animated film and illustration. In her work, she explores various expressions of artistic language, which leads her to experiment with many artistic techniques and stylistic approaches – from dramatic realism to gently lyrical images. Her illustrations decorate many books, and she regularly publishes them in children's magazines. In addition, as an animator and creator of artistic images, she participates in animated films for children and adults.



Jure Engelsberger DEATH AND A SHOEMAKER

folk tale, cunning, death, hell, humour, wish for immortality, ageing, adventure

An amusing adventure about trickery and wish for immortality

The cunning shoemaker from the fairy tale is not only a skilled master of his profession, but also a real trickster, who manages to dupe even death with his cleverness and thus completely change the structure of the world and bring chaos even in hell and heaven.

Jure Engelsberger has modernised the Slovenian folk tale in his own way, turning it into a lively adventure in which there is no shortage of wit and action, which is why this fun comic story will doubtlessly make us laugh – not only children, but also adults. The fairytale motifs intertwine with motifs from our modern times: death in the comic book is therefore not just a stereotypical old woman with a scythe, but rather a full-blooded and somewhat naive character, vainly enjoying her nice shoes and riding a motorbike to meet new challenges.

Jure Engelsberger (1977) is a versatile artist, active in the fields of illustration, comics, classical animation, graphic design and music. As a guitarist and drummer, he has participated in various musical groups and illustrated several books for children and youth. Moreover, he is also interested in the Japanese narrative theatre kamishibai. He has received several recognitions, nominations and awards for his work.



Marjan Manček HAPPY-GO-LUCKY'S SHIRT

folk tale, the search for happiness, contentment, modesty

How to find happiness and contentment?

Why are some people happy and others so unhappy with their lives? Can a wealthy ruler be more miserable than someone who has nothing? What is it that makes us happy and brings us personal satisfaction? The folk take Happy-Go-Lucky's Shirt poses all these questions, in which a terminally ill king searches the whole world for someone who would never be dissatisfied, but always content with everything. One of the royal doctors advised the king that the shirt of such a lucky human would solve all the king's problems and eliminate all ninety-nine diseases that plagued him. King's messengers hardly find such a person, but when they do, it turns out that he cannot help the king... The fairy tale, equipped with colourful and roguish images, teaches us that each of us carries our happiness above all in our hearts.

Marjan Manček (1948) is a renowned Slovenian comics artist, illustrator, creator of books for children and youth and of animated films. He's an amazing storyteller with a kind sense of humour, a sophisticated and creative approach to language and a flair for precise design of his main characters: curious explorers of their environment, much like children are. His work is infused with warm humour and characterized by an unobtrusive educational note. His light, flowing drawings are lucid and full of playful imagination. He received, among other awards, the Hinko Smrekar Lifetime Achievement Award at the 12th Slovenian Biennial of Illustration in 2016.

A well-known tale comes to life in this rendition of a classical story of the cricket who plays his fiddle all summer long while the hard-working ants are toiling and gathering resources for the winter. When the cold season comes, the cricket is saved by the ants and taken into the ant hive to play for their pleasure. A story about both the virtue of work and the virtue of art that shows how important it is to cooperate and stay in solidarity with each other.

Maja Kastelic's style is always absolutely wholesome and friendly, her simple shapes and gentle colours appeal to young readers, invoking the feeling of a "happy place" where it is safe to read and learn and grow one's imagination.

Maja Kastelic (1981) is an award-winning children's book author and illustrator. She has received a range of prizes and awards for her work in illustration. Her wordless picture book 'Deček in hiša' (A Boy and a House) was selected for the Bologna Illustrators Exhibition, the White Ravens Catalogue, Kirkus Best Wordless Picture Books and the IBBY Honour List. She collaborates with some of the most prestigious publishers in Slovenia and abroad.



Igor Šinkovec A HUNTER'S LUCK

folk tale, animals, humour, imagination, daydreaming, luck, illusion

Good fortune is volatile

This very entertaining folk tale retells the story of a young, naive, and reckless hunter who finds a rabbit in the forest, asleep under a tree. He starts imagining how he captures the rabbit and trades it for a hen which will lay eggs and have chickens, then sells them and buys a nanny goat that will have kids which he will also sell away and so on, until he's able to afford a horse. His excitement over the possibility of owning a horse leads him to inadvertently yell "Yeehaw!". This wakes up the rabbit that escapes and disappears just as the hunter's dreams of riding a horse.

A major part of the story take place within the hunter's imagination, and this makes it a sort of "a comic within a comic" with which the artist is stretching the comics format and creating an interesting visual dynamic. The biggest strength of the story lies definitely in Šinkovec's use of an exaggeratedly cartoony style which reinforces the humorous nature of the tale.

Igor Šinkovec (1978) is an illustrator, animator and comics artist. He's been collaborating with many publishing houses in Slovenia and abroad, illustrating children's books, while his illustrations are being regularly published in the Slovenian children's and youth magazines. He has received several awards for his work in illustration.



Gašper Rus THE FOUR MUSICIANS

folk tale, music, power of art, thankfulness, poverty, life in the past

Thankfulness is a virtue

This amusing story is about four musicians who have been cheated out of their pay and had to go back home penniless. On the way back they must camp overnight next to some ruins, and they decide to play a song to cheer themselves up. An odd old man comes from the ruins, congratulates them for their music and gives them each a walnut branch. Other band members scoff at the gift and throw it away, but one takes it home where, over the night, the branch turns out to be made of solid gold.

A skilled use of colour and a dynamic & flowing drawing style are the hallmarks of Rus' story. At the same time, his story authentically depicts life in the past and teaches children to be thankful for each gift, even if it seems insignificant.

Gašper Rus (1983) is a comics artist, illustrator, and animator. He made his debut in the Stripburger magazine, later becoming one of its editors. He has worked with other Slovenian newspapers and magazines, illustrating children's books and textbooks for several Slovene publishing houses. Translation of his graphic novel 'Gugalnica' (The Swing; based on a script by Žiga Valetič) has been published in France (La balançoire, Des ronds dans l'O, 2016).



Tanja Komadina WHY DO DOGS SNIFF EACH OTHER

How a pepper-less party changed the behaviour of dogs forever

His Majesty the Lion gets bored with his life, nothing can make him happy, so he decides to prepare a huge feast. All the animals come, the tables are full of foods, the band plays, but His Majesty still can't find any satisfaction – now he thinks it's only because there's no pepper on the table. He sends his servant dogs to find pepper, which explains why the dogs like sniffing each other so much: they're still looking for the pepper shaker for the king!

This humorous story is well illustrated and employs a rich language with many puns, while children can recognize different human qualities in the animals' behaviour, which makes them appreciate the story even more.

Tanja Komadina (1976) is a comics artist and illustrator. She works as an illustrator of books for children and youth for several Slovene publishing houses and has her work regularly published in the Slovenian children's magazines. Her clear and distinct style of drawing seems to appeal to young readers, while her illustrations often feature elements of comics. She's received several awards for her work. Her comic book debut 'Fino kolo' (Cool Bike) has been selected for the prestigious White Ravens 2015 catalogue.



miha ha YOU CANNOT PLEASE EVERYONE ALL THE TIME

A truly universal life lesson clearly understandable to everyone

A father and son travel to the market to sell their donkey. At first the boy rides a donkey and the father walks by, but people they meet criticize them for being unfair towards the poor old man. When they change positions, people in the next village object to poor little boy walking. Then they both walk and people mock them for being stupid for not riding the donkey. Finally, they both ride the donkey and people complain about their cruelty towards the poor animal. »There's always something wrong. Because ... you cannot please everyone all the time,« states the father, but it doesn't matter any longer – they have reached their destination.

Miha ha's clear and obvious drawing, spiced up with just the right number of details, makes for a flowing narrative. The scenes are rich in visual depictions of farming and country work that contribute to the educational value of the book.

Miha Hančič (1986) who hides under the penname of miha ha, is a comics artist and illustrator. He mostly creates comics for the youngest readers (often in tandem with the writer Maša Ogrizek) and these are regularly published in Slovenian children's magazines. He has also illustrated several children's books. He has also received several awards for his work in illustration and comics.



Matej Lavrenčič THE PRETENTIOUS MISS MONKEY

fable, monkey, vanity, public image, egocentrism, values

Perfect story for the contemporary selfobsessed times

The little Miss Monkey, never caring for anything but herself, her looks, her hairstyle, nail polish and Facebook profile, made herself a garland one day and went for a walk to the nearby forest. Suddenly a lion came out of the bushes and chased the monkey. Unfortunately, Miss Monkey couldn't escape as she got stuck on a branch with the garland around her neck and nobody could help her. Her extreme and egoistic vanity cost her life and the little Miss Monkey learned a very important lesson in the end.

The story teaches children the importance of things other than physical appearance and good looks.

Matej Lavrenčič (1980) works in animation, comics and illustration. He started publishing his short comics stories with the Stripburger magazine. He has also received several domestic and international awards for his work in animation.

Yet another proof of how brains beat brawn every time

Beastie the monster is a voracious but a less than brilliant creature that one day goes hunting rabbits and coincidentally gets caught in a trap. Luckily the beast can escape thanks to the help of a passerby peasant who almost get eaten by the hungry beast. But then a smart and cunning fox enters the stage and brings an amusing plot twist. Playing the role of a lawyer in a courtroom, the fox tricks Beastie into climbing back into the trap and thus saving the nearly eaten peasant.

Krančan employs his thought-out and lively artistic imagination to design meaningful and multi-layered stories. The cartoony look of the characters quickly seduces the young reader's eye and heavily contributes to the instant likeability of the book.

David Krančan (1984) is a comics artist, illustrator, and graphic designer, for more than a decade, he is also a comics editor at the Stripburger comics magazine. His illustrations are regularly published by newspapers and magazines in Slovenia. Some of his biggest strengths include theoretical sagacity, skillful montage, relatable characters, and extreme attention to details. He has also received several domestic awards for his work in comics and illustration.

What goes around comes around

A fox is a cunning animal, that much is true, but even though it's able to escape all troubles it gets into, trick a hungry and naïve wolf and eat all the farmer's sausages, it still gets tricked itself by the crows with their promise to teach it how to fly. The reader is thus reassured that "what goes around comes around" and that a thieving, cheating and backstabbing fox will receive a just punishment.

This comic book tries to appeal to our moral sense of justice and features an intriguing and dynamic plot presented in a very specific and unique visual style, while the artist throws in several entertaining bits into the story as well.

Kaja Avberšek (1983) is a visual artist, creating in the fields of comics, illustration, object design, theatre scenography and text writing. Her comics shine with a playful departure from the conventions of the comics medium on a formal level and with an extremely stylized, almost pictographic drawing.

Within unity lies strength

Gravity is inescapable, as a chicken learns when a nut falls on its head. Thinking the world is ending, the chicken panics and runs for its life while a cock, a goose and a ram follow it on a very special adventure. When it gets dark, they follow a light in the distance and come to an empty house, get in and fall asleep. The story escalates when this group of animal friends beats and scares away a group of evil thieves.

The book is innovative in its use of ready-made, thrown away and then re-used objects that are combined, arranged, and shaped as characters of the story.

Common sense and a little ingenuity prevails

A snowy countryside, far from cities and people, a cold that cuts to the bone, the crackling sounds from the fireplace and the pleasant warmth of home where an elderly couple lives in peace and tranquillity. The old man sets off to the woods to fetch firewood and inadvertently wakes up a bear. The hungry bear wants to eat him, but the clever old man tricks it by giving him a glove instead of a hand under a pretence that it's a good idea to try him first before eating him.

Štular intricately weaves this story of an encounter between man and beast with a thought-out visual design. He used different items and objects: pieces of wood, stone, metal and other scrap material in the collage technique to recreate the atmosphere of a Russian folk tale full of microdramaturgy and small meaningful details.



This book of questions employs a poetic style of drawing to take children to tree canopies and meadows where many unknown and interesting animals and other things hide. It teaches young readers how to understand visual narratives in images without words and is dedicated to pre-school children, to their parents and to all those young at heart who value curiosity, playfulness, and humour.

A beautiful hide-and-seek book filled with fun things to look for! The story is bilingual and thus perfect for the early steps of learning English as a foreign language.

Saša Kerkoš (1977) is a graphic designer, illustrator, and comics artist. Her work is characterized by a bold experimentation on the fringes of sequential art and illustration. THE HILLIES is a collection of one-page black & white comics that deal with the peculiar conditions of being human in the times of prehistory and shows the everyday life of a curious and inquisitive prehistoric family. A slightly dreamy and philosophically inspired father marvels at life, nature and everything, his much more grounded wife urges him to provide something to put in their cauldron, while their little cutesy son is still learning the ropes and about life in general.

The Hillies are by far the most popular creation of Marjan Manček, an illustrator and comics artist with a long line of works dedicated especially to children. His simple drawing style and a didactical approach, presented as light-hearted humour, allow him to create evergreen comics that kids enjoy and parents appreciate. Excellent comics fun for the whole family!

A touching story about a refugee boy who dreams of owning a bicycle

COOL BIKE is based on a short story that deals with unfulfillment of a strong child's desire and with the unfortunate consequences of a forceful realization of it. The protagonist is a little boy from Mostar (Bosnia) who dreams of owning a bicycle but cannot have one. In the meantime, war breaks out and he escapes as a refugee to Slovenia, where he befriends Lana, a girl who owns the same bike he always wanted. When the bike gets stolen, Mile is accused of being the thief and a 'Balkan gypsy'. The bike is then returned but the slander sticks.

A heart-breaking story where the young reader can empathize with the protagonist and learn the lesson along with him. The story features a consistent artistic style and a distinct moral note with added educational value.

Neža Šivec SHARDS

homeless, violence, alcoholism, coming of age, dysfunctional family, drugs, fringes of society, searching for a home

How to put your life back together from the shards?

Maja can no longer bear to be at home. There are quarrel, violence and sadness in her home. She is also absent from school with increasing frequency. She seeks solace from a young homeless person, Jon. But Jon is sometimes hard to find. Maja wanders the streets of Ljubljana, from one homeless person to the other, asking where her friend might be loitering.

With relentless immediacy, but also empathy, the comic book *Shards* uncovers a world from which we usually look away, even though it exists very close to us. A world of people from the margins of society who, each in their own way and often in vain, try to put the pieces of their broken lives back together again. The author of the comic, Neža Šivec, found inspiration for creating the book in the experiences she gained while working in a humanitarian organization, which is dedicated to helping the homeless in particular. For the comic book she chose an expressive technique of drawing in charcoal, rarely seen in comics, which effectively reflects an uncertain existence of the main protagonist.

Neža Šivec (1996) obtained her master's degree in illustration at the Academy of Fine Arts and Design, University of Ljubljana, with a dissertation on comics in 2021. As a student, she has participated in several group exhibitions. Shards is her comic book debut.





This witty and engaging comics story shows the adventures of two human-like cats who realize they have plenty of "little black worries" in their lives. Question arises: how to get rid of them? Simply drawn characters animate this straightforward narrative that provides a lucid and amusing commentary on modern life, stress, burnout, and fear. This is why it's appropriate for younger readers, but older ones will appreciate it as well, since this timeless story with relatable characters and a lighthearted approach will never get old.

Matej Kocjan Koco MYSTERIOUS WORLD OF ELEMENTS

The development of modern chemistry in comics

chemistry, history of chemistry, chemical elements, science, education

A didactic graphic novel which brings the reader closer to the history of chemistry

The comic book features several stories that present the basic principles and laws of chemistry. It's not just stories on discoveries of chemical elements, they also explain why and how they were discovered. The script for the book was adapted from the 'Element Tales' book by I. Nechayev, first published in the USSR in 1940. It is also a story of evolution of modern chemistry and of scientists that tried to make sense of the world – our lives wouldn't be as they are without them.

The animal serves as a leitmotiv and as a narrator who observes our human actions without commenting upon it.

Koco's forthright artwork and Nikolovski's expressive verbalization gently stimulate the conscience of the young reader and remind them that a better world is possible and reachable - for all of us, if only we join forces and strive for greater solidarity between us all, regardless of who we are and where we come from.
